
#### AAUW AWARDS

#### ATTENDANCE LINE

Remember, students <u>and</u> parents are responsible for school attendance. The parent or legal guardian of any student living with them, even if over 18 years old, who is absent from class is requested to leave a phone message on the **Emerson Attendance Line at 425-936-2306** *within 48 hours of* the absence to explain the circumstances of an absence.

If the parent is aware of an upcoming absence, please call to notify the school <u>in ad-</u> <u>vance</u>. For vacation or extended absences, the student must pick up a form in the office for teachers and parent to sign <u>prior to the absence</u>.

If your student was absent from any classes during a particular day, you will receive an automated attendance call after 6:45 PM on that day. If that absence needs to be excused, please call and leave a message on the EMHS attendance line, via email to the Office Manager at mosness@lwsd.org, or supply a parent or physician note.

The only medications that can be self-carried by students are epipens and emergency inhalers.

We must have proper documentation for students to self-carry these meds.

#### **MEDICATION AT SCHOOL**

Students are NOT allowed to have even non-prescription medication on them at school – all medication must go through the Emerson Office, contact Sally Jenkins.

Parents/guardians are responsible for:

- Supplying all medications/transporting medication to and from school.
- Completing required <u>medication authorization forms</u>. An <u>authorization to admin-ister medication form</u> must be turned in for each medication whether prescription or non-prescription. The form must be signed by the health care provider and parent and/or guardian. Medication cannot be given without the completed form.
- All prescribed medication must be in the original, labeled prescription bottle, container or package.
- All non-prescription medication must be in original container and labeled by the parent, <u>including</u>: Student Name, Medication Name, Dosage, Date Issued, Name of Health Care Provider, and Time medication is to be given.

Scheduled medications are given between 11:00 AM - 1:00 PM only.

# Fall Smarter Balanced Assessment PDF reports available through Skyward/Family Access

In fall of 2021, students in 4th-9th and 11th grades took the Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) in English language arts and math. Students in 6th, 9th and 12th grade took the Washington State Comprehensive Assessment of Science (WCAS). The primary purpose of these tests was a brief check-in on how students are doing compared to some of the state standards.

Scores from these tests were posted to Family Access in December under "Test Scores." OSPI has now provided electronic score reports in PDF format to the district for the students that took the fall test. These score reports do not provide any new student score data; however, they do provide some graphical and textual explanations of the data. These score reports are now in Family Access.

To access the PDF score report:

- 1. Login to Family Access.
- 2. Select "Portfolio" on the left menu.
- 3. Select "Show Scores" for the assessment.

Skyward Family Access support is available on the LWSD website.

Scores from the spring 2022 state tests for ELA and math are typically available by end of June. A communication will be sent when these scores are posted to Family Access.

### PARENT ACCESS

The LWSD provides access to student information including student records, lunch accounts, and more via the Internet. This information is secure so that only you can see information about your student (s). The system through which you can view this information is called **Parent Access**.

When you are registered at school, you have secure access to the following types of student information:

- E-mail links to your student's teachers
- Volunteer Application
- Ability to make online credit card payments for fees/fines
- Family Access: the system that provides official student information on your student (s), including emergency contacts, attendance, end of term report card grades, immunization records, parent/guardian information, fees, etc.

#### FREE/REDUCED LUNCH PROGRAM

Nutrition Services offers a limited breakfast program at Emerson. Some options that are provided include items that can be heated in the microwave such as breakfast sandwiches. There are other cold items available such as cereal, breakfast bars, and bagels and cream cheese. Breakfast is available daily between 7:30-7:50 a.m. and between classes until fourth period.

For the 2021-22 school year, student meals will continue to be provided free of charge at all schools, regardless of income level. This USDA nationwide waiver allows for meals for the 2021-22 school year only. Even though there will be no charge for student meals, the Point of Sale computer system for meal accounting will still be utilized with a "no charge" for meals. Students will be able to purchase an extra entrée, meal, milk, and other ala carte items for an extra charge.

# Several benefits come with filling out a School Meal Application; **not just meals!**

Even though meals are free this year, we strongly encourage all parents/guardians who might be eligible for benefits to submit an application. Completing an application takes less than 10 minutes, and parents only need to complete one application per family.



#### LWSD ON-SITE COVID-19 TESTING AVAILABLE



Lake Washington School District (LWSD) is committed to providing a safe environment to our students and staff. Part of that commitment is to adapt to the constant changes related to the COVID-19 pandemic. Last month, LWSD received guidance from the Department of Health to help lead us through this next phase of the pandemic. Part of that guidance included language regarding testing and how the school district can maintain this important resource for the students and staff of LWSD.

The process LWSD is following related to COVID-19 on-site testing has changed with this newest guidance. Families can still expect to see a COVID-19 exposure notification when we are notified of a positive case on campus. The notification will provide instructions for how to sign up for testing. If a family wants their student to be tested, then they need to have the opt-in form signed. It is only after the opt-in form is signed can families sign up their student to be tested and entered into the testing schedule. The opt-in form only needs to be completed once per school year.
